4. RESOLUTION 2024-04 OAKLEY CITY CIVILITY POLICY AND RULES OF DECORUM

Recorder Rydalch presented the council with the proposed civility policy and rules of decorum. She emphasized the importance of maintaining order and respect during city council meetings and interactions with the public. She stated that the goal of the policy is to establish clear expectations for behavior, how to address disruptive behavior, and ensuring a productive and harassment-free workplace. She outlined enforcement protocols, including verbal warnings, removal from premises, and further actions for persistent issues. The policy also included specific rules for public meetings, such as discouraging boisterous conduct and ensuring that public comments are addressed to the Mayor and Council.

Mayor Woolstenhulme asked the Council for comments.

Councilmembers expressed their favorable opinions.

Councilmember Frazier motioned to adopt Resolution 2024-004 Oakley City Civility Policy and Rules of Decorum. **Councilmember Wilmoth** seconded the motion. No further discussion. Vote was unanimous. **Resolution 2024-004 adopted.**

Mayor Woolstenhulme suggested that the rules of decorum and the civility policy be displayed in public areas at meetings and public hearings to set expectations for all attendees.

5. RESOLUTION 2024-05 OAKLEY CITY PRIVACY SPACE COMPLIANCE PLAN

257 from the 2024 legislative session. This plan will address the required compliance with the Utah State Code regarding restroom facilities. The plan ensures that single-occupant facilities are designated as privacy spaces as they are isolated lockouts. Discussion regarding signage and need to add Child changing stations to the men's rooms at arena, Red Barn, and Cattlemen's Hall. The plan also includes the required provision for all new facilities constructed after May 1, 2024, must have at least one single occupant facility.

Recorder Rydalch presented the privacy space compliance plan, required by State House Bill

Councilmember Frazier communicated that enforcement of the privacy space policy will reside with the Summit County Sheriff's department.

Councilmember Frazier motioned to approve Resolution 2025-05 Oakley City Privacy Space Compliance Plan. **Councilmember Wilmoth** seconded the motion. No further discussion. All voted in favor. **Resolution 2025-05 Adopted.**

6. MOTORIZED VEHICLES PROHIBITED ON TRAILS AND PUBLIC PATHWAYS – 3RD READING.

After presentation of the proposed draft ordinance Mayor Woolstenhulme questioned the need

for the ordinance.

84 Councilmember Smart responded with concern over motorbikes as well as some classifications 85 of e-bikes being on trails that could endanger other users. 86 87 Consensus amongst Council regarding the prohibition of motorcycles, ATVs, and dirt bikes but 88 larger discussion regarding the regulations around classifications of e-bikes, age, and speed. 89 Discussion centered around the difficulty in enforcing the proposed provisions. Further 90 discussion regarding age restrictions for youth and whether it is practical to include in the 91 ordinance. 92 93 Further discussion amongst Councilmembers to further simplify the ordinance. Eliminate 94 restrictions for younger ages and simplify language for classifications of E-Bikes and where they 95 can be utilized. 96 97 Councilmember Smart moved to approve the ordinance for third reading with the changes discussed. 98 Councilmember Neff seconded the motion. All voted in favor. Third Reading approved. Bring back 99 with changes for Public Hearing and possible adoption. 100 101 102 7. MAYOR REPORT: 103 a.
