1. **Mayor Pro-Tempore J. Frazier** opened the meeting.

2. **Meeting called to order:**

3. **PUBLIC COMMENT:**

None Received.

4. **CONSENT CALENDAR (ACTION ITEM) Approval/Denial**

Councilmember Smart motioned to approve the consent calendar items. **Councilmember Wilmoth** seconded the motion. No further discussion. All voted in favor. **Consent Calendar Approved.**

42 **5. GENERAL BUSINESS**

43 **Mayor Pro Tem Frazier** informed the Council that there will need to be special session called for
44 the Canvass of the 2025 election. The County will not have the official canvass report ready
45 until November 17th and by law we need to have the certification of the election completed by
46 November 18th. He asked the Council to make note of the special meeting scheduled for
47 Tuesday November 18th.

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49 **Councilmember Reports:**

50 **Councilmember Wilmoth** reported on the most recent rodeo committee meeting. He
51 reported that the rodeo committee would like to eliminate the drone show and apply those
52 funds toward increased prize money. The Mayor has communicated that he would like to
53 potentially keep the drones for the celebration on the 4th. This will be discussed at one of the
54 November meetings when he is back in town.

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58 **6. PUBLIC HEARING: CONSIDERATION OF OAKLEY CITY ANNEXATION OF SUMMIT COUNTY**
59 **PARCEL CD-258 "DEER MEADOWS RANCH" AND ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE 2025-02 (ACTION**
60 **ITEM) Approval/Denial:**

61 **Recorder Rydalch** presented Council with Exhibit A (Oakley City Map) indicating the current
62 legal boundaries of the city as well as the area of the unincorporated peninsula. She pointed
63 out the location of the parcel under consideration and explained that the parcel splits county
64 and city jurisdictions with the home/facility situated across the jurisdictional boundary.

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66 She summarized the process to date. The City initiated the process by adopting a resolution in
67 the September 10th City Council meeting that declared an intent to annex CD-258; notice was
68 posted and given for 30 days, and a public hearing is scheduled. There have been no formal
69 protests received and the County has expressed they are amenable to the annexation. After the
70 Public Hearing, the Council may take formal action regarding the annexation. As an information
71 item she stated that by code any properties being annexed into the City automatically are
72 assigned zoning of Agricultural Residential -40.

75 She then reviewed the statutory requirements that the City believes have been met: the area
76 must be primarily residential or commercial, the city must provide municipal services (provides
77 culinary water), must have a population under 800 persons, the total area is under 50 acres
78 (11.53 acres) and is located within the City's annexation area.

80 **Councilmember Wilmoth** asked about the various boundary lines on the map depicting the
81 unincorporated peninsula and whether any of the other property owners in the area were open
82 to annexation. **Recorder Rydalch** stated that the other property owner was reached out to and
83 they do not at this time have an interest in annexation.

Councilmember Wilmoth motioned to open the Public Hearing to receive comments on the possible annexation of Summit County Parcel CD-258. **Councilmember Neff** seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

8:23 PM Public Hearing opened for comment.

Chris Dillman, 35 East Oakridge Lane, Oakley UT: "So, the property is being serviced by Oakley city water existing, I heard there's a cost associated potentially with the annexation. So, first question is, do we understand what that cost would be and how that gets born? And then the second would be, is there any other obligations to the city, once that property is annexed in. Thank you."

Recorder Rydalch indicated that there would be minimal survey costs and a recording fee at the County.

Councilmember Wilmoth asked for confirmation that the County was in favor of the annexation.

Recorder Rydalch stated that the County would prefer the City move forward with the annexation.

No further public comment received.

Councilmember Smart motioned to close the Public Hearing. **Councilmember Wilmoth** seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

8:29 Public Hearing Closed.

Councilmember Smart motioned to adopt Ordinance 2025-02 Annexation of Summit County Parcel CD-258. **Councilmember Neff** seconded the motion. All voted in the affirmative. **Ordinance 2025-02 adopted.**

7. RESOLUTION 2025-07 ADOPTION OF OAKLEY SEWER INSTALLATION DESIGN STANDARDS AND SPECIFICATIONS. (ACTIONABLE)

Recorder Rydalch described the updated sewer installation design standards prepared by Aqua Engineering with input from Water Operator, Dallas Hansen, and Wastewater Operator, Daxton Hansen, as well as Larry Hall with Aqua Environmental. The standards are intended to provide builders and contractors connecting to sewer and culinary water will have the sizing, material, bedding type etc. the City prefers. She noted that two items will need to be added to the standards later – specifications for grease trap systems and private sewer pumps for below-elevation residents within statutory proximity.

Councilmember Neff motioned to adopt Resolution 2025-07 Adoption of Oakley City Sewer Installation Design Standards and Specifications. **Councilmember Kimber** seconded the motion. All voted in favor. Resolution adopted.


8. POSSIBLE CLOSED SESSION – NO SESSION WAS HELD
